## Introduction

We cannot as Christians celebrate Halloween but we are aware that many families enjoy the time to dress up and eat sweets.

It is a great opportunity for us as churches to share the light Jesus offers as a contrast to the dark spaces the commercial world encourages. We can choose to celebrate All Saint's Day or a Light Party as a way of bringing families together. We can meet in church, in a hall or outside with a Light Trail.

If you can, consider meeting on the 31<sup>st</sup> to give families another option than to go trick or treating. As dressing up is a central part of the secular event why not encourage children to dress as super-heroes, heroes or princesses. If your event is over tea-time consider offering hotdogs – easy and popular (don't forget your Food Hygiene certificate). Have a chance to share Jesus' love, offer crafts and games and make sure you have sweets for them to take home.

If you have a large outdoor garden think about a Light Party fireworks and bonfire evening. What a great way to offer hotdogs and toast marshmallows and have a time of worship and a short talk.

**A Light Trail** is a simple way to invite families in your community to follow a trail of light around your neighbourhood, reflecting on the light of Christ in a gentle, fun and accessible way. It is perfect for sharing with Sunday School, Children's Groups and Messy Church Families. All it takes is 5 or 10 households in a walkable distance from each other to create a light display in a front window or garden, using simple templates. Each light stop links to a Bible verse.
